I have now read the report which you kindly sent. I would now like to bring something of importance to your attention and also to the attention of Mr. Vasquez .

In the report it does not refer to the district of George Town which included claims for the South Sound Area. When the Claims were submitted for the other areas mentioned in the report the George Town affidavits were definitely included to support the claims. The group has the records to show that we did include the George Town area which were all delivered to the Planning Department whom I understand turned over all claims to the Lands and Survey Department.

The report was never shown to the group until we requested it therefore it is only now that the group is in a position to draw to your attention that the claims for this area is not referred to. I do appreciate that you all were not involved in the report.

In petitioning to secure beach access along our coast line are for all areas claimed by supporting evidence which included the George Town/South Sound area. If it is an oversight kindly have this matter dealt with as the report is a first issue from 2003 and has not been up dated since from what I can gather.

Your attention is also drawn that it is recommended in the report that the Barkers and the Salt Creek are excluded because of a greater development framework. These are established accesses which the public has used for generations and in dealing with the problem surrounding public beach access that this recommendation be looked into as it could really result in a denial of access and waterways in these areas.

Hi Rupert,

I have reviewed the guidelines for the use of beach access and can vaguely recall having sight of this document sometime in the distant past.

While I have no knowledge of this document being vetted by our Legal Department or it ever being circulated, it seems to follow my opinion on the public's use of our beaches.

You may recall that during the late Sir Vassel Johnson's tenure as Minister responsible for Lands, he had amending legislation enacted to alter the pre-existing definition of the high-water mark insofar as it related to beaches and the mangroves. While this was never repealed, we do, as the guidelines highlight, have some relief under the Prescription Law.

Accordingly, you have my approval to circulate these guidelines to Mr. Dilbert and whoever else having an interest in this matter.

WHILE THIS WAS NEVER REPEALED WE DO, AS THE GUIDELINES HIGHLIGHT, HAVE SOME RELIEF UNDER THE PRESCRIPTION LAW.

GUIDELINES FOR OWNERS AND MANAGERS OF BEACHFRONT PROPERTIES

1. In order to dispel any confusion or misunderstanding which may have arisen in the past over the rights which members of the public enjoy over Cayman's beaches the following guidelines may be of assistance, especially to managers of beachfront hotels and other tourism related beachfront properties.
2. The public access to Cayman's beaches is by the recognised public rights of way which are usually clearly marked on maps and physically on the ground. Landowners over whose land these public rights of way exist are under a legal duty to make sure that they are kept free and clear of any obstruction or debris.
3. Once members of the public arrive on the beach the following rules apply.
4. The seaward boundary of a landowner's or tenant's property is, in tidal waters, the mean high water mark. Between the mean high water mark and the low water mark, known as "foreshore", the land belongs to the Crown as does anything below the sea up to the limit of territorial waters.
5. Where, however, a landowner's property consists of "beach" above the mean high water mark, then the usual rule, that a landowner can eject anyone he chooses from his land, is displaced.
6. Members of the public have the right to use any part of Cayman's beaches for recreation even though the part of the beach being used is on private property, i.e. is above the mean high water mark. Such a public right is one of a group of rights which members of the public enjoy, even over private land, in the Cayman Islands. It is a right which the law presumes to have existed for many years and which members of the public have acquired under the Prescription Law.
7. Whilst members of the public have no rights to use private property such as beach furniture which belongs to beachfront property owners, they may not be prevented from using the beach or passing to and fro along the beach even where the beach they use is on private land. Hotel managers should ensure that all staff working on the beach such as security personnel and food and beverage staff are aware of the law and that the public right to use any part of the beach is not restricted or limited in any way.

Haiti struggles in its recovery from TS Jeanne

GONAIVES, Haiti (AP) - A year since catastrophic floods unleashed by a tropical storm swallowed this gritty city in Haiti's barren northwest, residents are still struggling to pick up the pieces and move on from one of the impoverished country's worst natural disasters.

Tropical Storm Jeanne brushed a corner of Haiti's

Cattle industry in decline

Jamaican Agricultural interests are now moving swiftly to draft measures to prevent the demise of the island's cattle industry, which has declined by 50 per cent in the last 10 years, according to a study commissioned by the Jamaica Livestock Association (JLA).

The decline, the study noted, has resulted in a serious shortage in the availability of local beef to satisfy local demand. According to the study, the findings of which were presented on the first day of a three-day conference which started last Friday on the local cattle sector at the Breezes Runaway Bay Hotel, in St. Ann, the current demand for local beef is

two times the amount of available cattle. The decline of the sector had a negative impact on employment, especially in the rural areas with the loss of more than 13,000 jobs, which the consultants who carried out the study concluded, has led to an increase in poverty in rural areas. Information compiled from data received from the Ministry of Agriculture's data bank indicate that the number of cattle slaughtered annually fell by 38.4 per cent. The study also found that the dairy industry suffered a significant 66 per cent decrease in the amount of milk produced during the same period.



Beach access policy needed

Once again, the issue of beach access is stirring up controversy in our community, as it seems to do on an almost annual basis.

This time, the same tourist family was booted off the Westin Casuarina Resort beach last August has been embarrasingly expelled by police again.

The reason behind this particular family finding itself in the same situation, at the same beach, with the same problem makes for an interesting discussion.

However, that discussion totally misses the point. The issue that really needs to be addressed is what rights do citizens, residents and visitors of this country have on our beaches.

There are laws in place that protect the public's right to traverse all of Cayman's shorelines, but the question of how far inland that right goes seems to be open to interpretation.

The Westin believes it can protect all the land inwards from the mean high water mark, which is the way the law is written.

The Westin paid millions of dollars for the property and to build the hotel. It believes the guests of the resort, who also pay a lot of money to stay there, deserve the right to use an un-crowded beach on what they believe is private property.

The real problem is the mean high water mark is an imaginary line that is different from place to place along the shore and could change over the course of the year with every storm that passes.

Some believe setbacks should start at the line of natural vegetation, but as Minister of Planning Kurt Tibbells noted last week, there is virtually no natural vegetation left on some sections of Cayman's shoreline because of development, which means such a setback would be just as imaginary as the mean high water mark.

What is needed is a law that offers a definitive and practical way of measuring the shoreline area which is for public use.

Without such a law, this issue of beach access will continue to create controversy, irritating residents, visitors and property-owners alike.

With all of the other post-tourism issues we face, this is no time to be waging a long and costly legal battle.

Dear Mr. Carson Ebanks,

As Chairman of the Concerned Citizens Group ("CCG"), I am following up on the emails below in relation to the above subject, and in particular I respectfully refer you to Ms. Marilyn Conolly's email to me of 30 June 2005.

On your review of the relevant correspondence and documents files it will be confirmed that the CCG has been pursuing this most important issue of public Rights of Way, Beach Accesses and Waterways for a significant number of years during which we have not only corresponded but met with successive Ministers and members of various Government departments including the Department of Planning and Lands and Survey. I am taking the privilege of copying this email to Mr. Kearney Gomez and Mr. Kenneth Ebanks, as they are both familiar with this matter.

Unfortunately, however, the issue of conclusively identifying, gazetting and protecting these public rights of way and accesses has not yet been finalized, notwithstanding that in November 2003 we were advised by letter from the then Hon. Minister, Mrs. Juliana O'Connor-Connolly, that the matter had progressed well and that completion was imminent.

The CCG followed up on that November 2003 letter, including arranging a meeting with the Lady Minister on 22nd February 2005 at which she informed us that because of a reshuffle in the Ministries responsibility for the matter had been assumed by the Hon. Minister Gilbert McLean. Mrs.

O'Connor-Connolly graciously arranged for members of the CCG to meet with him on 23rd February 2005 but, other than the emails below, we have not been informed of any further progress or finalization of the matter.

In the meantime, unhindered and unobstructed use by the public of various rights of way, accesses and waterways which had been used by many generations is slowly but surely being eroded and, once again, the Concerned Citizens Group are seeking an incumbent Government's resolution of this issue for the benefit of Caymanians, residents and visitors alike.

While we acknowledge that Cayman has been in a Hurricane Ivan recovery mode for virtually a year and will continue in that mode for quite some time, and, of course, that there was the time consuming but very important preparation for our General Elections in May 2005, the CCG nevertheless feel that there should be no further delay in finalizing this long outstanding matter.

We fully appreciate that the Hon. Minister Arden McLean has only recently taken over responsibility for this matter and also that there are many other important national and international issues presently being dealt with. However, the non-resolution of the issue of public Rights of Way, Beach Accesses and Waterways which the CCG have been pressing to have resolved for so many years is, in our opinion, becoming more critical each passing day, and we are therefore requesting that the

Hon. Minister together with other appropriate Government Departments make every effort to complete this at the earliest possible opportunity so that the public may be assured that their rights have not been taken away.

To this end, should the Hon. Minister wish to meet with the Concerned Citizens Group in order to progress this matter to its end, please do not hesitate to let me know and members will make themselves available at your convenience.

Thank you in anticipation of hearing from your Ministry as soon as possible.
